Small Group Questions

1. What is it that made the Suffering Servant willing to give up what His His rights? How does His example inform our own lives?
2. One of the reasons that the Suffering Servant's death was incongruous is that He is Creator and Sustainer. He has now also become our Savior. What does He deserve from us? What do we actually give Him? Why this great difference between deserved and given? How may we begin to address this?
3. The Suffering Servant is characterized as one who had done no violence. In another Suffering Servant song, this description is further developed (Isaiah 42:1-4) What application can we make of His harmlessness to our own Christian lives?
